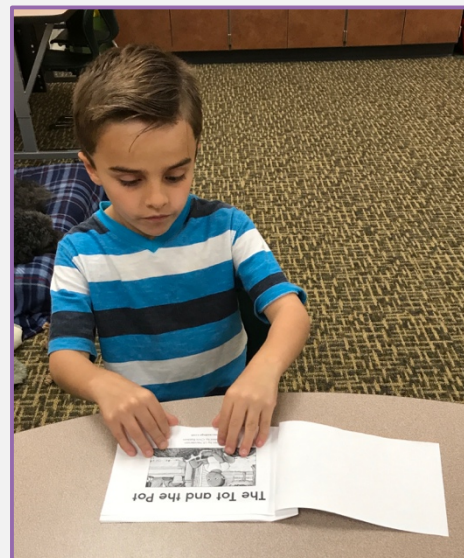


Title I
