B. REDUCTION IN FORCE

The Board approved the recommendation that a reduction-in-force be implemented for the employment contracts of the following individuals for the 2021-2022 school year due to financial reasons if the Pike-Delta-York Local School District 1% income tax levy on the May 4, 2021 ballot is voted down by district voters:

C. PROGRAM REDUCTIONS

The recommendation that the following programs be eliminated for the 2021-2022 school year due to financial reasons if the Pike-Delta-York Local School District 1% income tax levy on the May 4, 2021 ballot is voted down by district voters was approved by the Board:

1. Extra-curricular activities (Athletics, Clubs, Marching Band, etc.)
All athletic and non-athletic supplemental contracts eliminated
2. District Gifted program
3. Two-Year Kindergarten program
4. High school FFA program
5. No field trips or alternative educational opportunities districtwide.

D. TRANSPORTATION REDUCTIONS

The Board approved the recommendation that the transportation of district students be reduced to state minimum requirements for the 2021-2022 school year due to financial reasons if the Pike-Delta-York Local School District 1% income tax levy on the May 4, 2021 ballot is voted down by district voters. District transportation would be limited to the following:

1. Only transport students in grades K-8 who reside more than 2.0 miles from school (no transportation within a 2.0-mile radius of schools).

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D. TRANSPORTATION REDUCTIONS

2. No high school student transportation provided except as required by law (Four County Career Center students: school-to-school only).

Contract offers contingent upon both a clean and board acceptable BCI/FBI background check and appropriate licensure. All pay and benefits according to Board adopted policy.
