Academic Highlights

Purple Heart Designation from the Ohio Department of Education for providing support to military families.

First district in the State of Ohio to earn the HeartSafe School Designation for establishing a trained Cardiac Emergency Response Team (CERT) through Project Adam.

Award-winning preschool programming on-site through the Northwest Ohio Educational Service Center (NWOESC). Last year, our preschool was the only one out of 23 districts within the four county area to earn all five stars.

Academic Programming

Students learn 21st Century Skills in a 1:1 technology environment in grades 1-12.

All graduates complete a course in Personal Financial Management prior to graduation. They learn financial literacy skills, budgeting, and financial responsibility.

Academic support built into the school day at all three buildings in the district.

42 in-house elective courses and 160 online elective courses offered at Delta High School.

Prescriptive math support program at DMS was again awarded the Gold Medal Award from Ascend Math.

Academic Partnerships

- Partnerships with several postsecondary institutions to offer college-level courses to students through College Credit Plus (CCP) programming.
- Junior and senior students may attend Four County Career Center (FCCC), where students may enroll in one of 30 career and technical programs.
- PDY students participate in learning opportunities such as Career Exploration Day and Manufacturing Day to explore post-graduation options.
- DHS has partnered with Ohio Means Jobs to offer students courses through the Manufacturing Skill Standards Council (MSCC) program, which helps high school students building job readiness and employability skills.

Student Opportunities

PDY students regularly participate in academic competitions such as Odyssey of the Mind (OM), the Spelling Bee, Quiz Bowl competitions, Math Counts competition, Geography Bee, and National History Day.

DHS is home to an award-winning National FFA Organization program that boasts 75 State FFA Degrees and 15 American Degrees.

Students at Delta Middle School can earn up to 2.25 high school credits through advanced classes like Algebra I, Spanish I, and high school level Physical Education, which gives them the opportunity to take more advanced coursework in high school.

Student Leadership and Participation

Delta High School proudly offers students the chance to participate in 18 varsity level athletic programs and 11 academic club programs. The Pike-Delta-York Local School District is a proud and original member of the Northwest Ohio Athletic League (NWOAL).

Approximately 50% of Delta High School students participate in clubs and over 50% of DHS students participate in athletics. Approximately 50% of the students at Delta Middle School participate in either clubs, athletics, or both.

Delta Middle School students regularly volunteer in community events. These community service programs often include the annual community recycling, Rakin' the Town, Dinner Theater, the Annual Food Drive, Adopt-a-Family, Heart Radiothon, and a Veterans Day Breakfast and Recognition Assembly.



Community Service Projects

A number of student organizations at Delta High School complete community service projects each year. Every student in National Honor Society (NHS), Student Council, and FFA complete service work. These programs provide over a thousand hours of community service every year!

THE ARTS

Music

Over 1/3 of the high school student body participates in our award-winning music program. The DHS band boasts four All-Ohio State Fair marching band members, two selected to District Honors Band, and 15 students selected to the all-county band. The DHS vocal department includes the Del-Aires and the Women's Glee. Each year, DHS students are selected to the all-county choir and DHS choir students are invited to the District Honors Festival. DHS boasts an active Pep Band and Jazz Band in addition to our marching and concert bands.

Delta Middle School students are active in the performing arts program by participating in band and choir. The DMS band regularly sends students to the all-county band concert and the Junior High Solo and Ensemble Competition sponsored by the Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA). The DMS choir is proud to have 7th and 8th grade choir students selected to participate in the all-county choir concert each year.

Delta Elementary School has its very own performing arts program, which offers students in grades 2 and 4 the opportunity to be a part of a musical performance. In addition to their own musical program, elementary students are given the chance to be a part of the high school musical when younger roles are available.



Visual Arts

Delta High School is proud to offer students a wide variety of visual arts courses. Over 150 Delta High School students take an art class each year, which means that more than one-third of the DHS student body participates in visual arts! The award-winning artwork of our high school students is often featured in local and regional shows around the area, including the Black Swamp Arts Council High School Invitational (BSAC), the Governor's Show, and the Focus Show through the Arts Commission of Greater Toledo. Students have also had their work featured on billboards across the county.

Students at Delta Elementary School have their work featured at the Spring Arts Festival. Parents and community members are able to tour the building and see displays of our youngest students' artistic talents each spring. Students at Delta Middle School display their artwork at the Spring Fling each spring, too.

FISCAL STEWARDSHIP

The Pike Delta York Local School District was established in 1966. The School District serves an area of approximately seventy-three square miles. It is located in Fulton County, and includes all of the Village of Delta and portions of Fulton, Pike, Swancreek, and York Townships. The School District is staffed by

- approximately 60 classified staff
- approximately 80 certified teaching staff, and
- 7 administrators

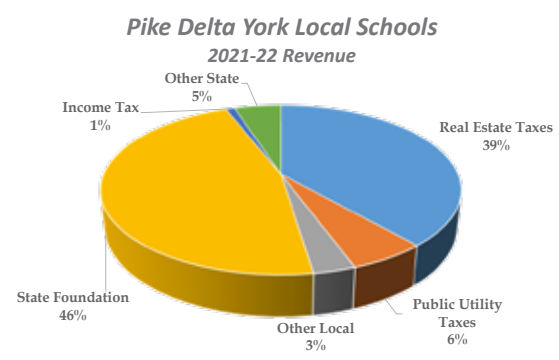
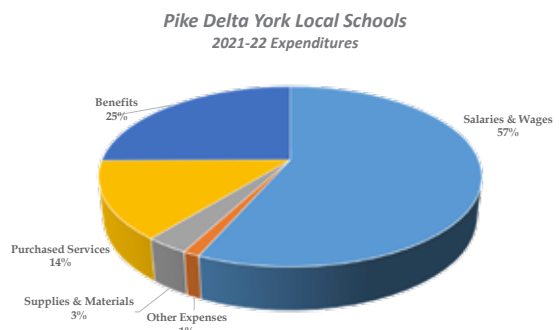
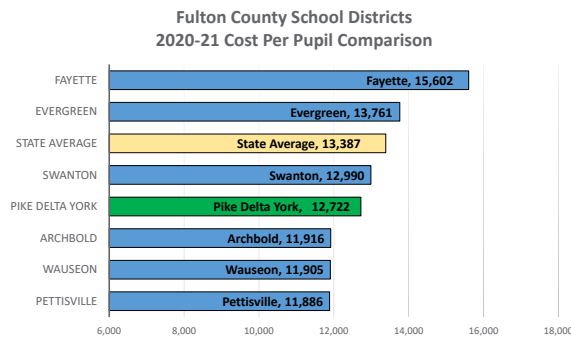
serving approximately 1,350 students. The School District currently operates four instructional buildings, an administration building, and a bus garage.

The District continues to encourage economic growth in Fulton County and more specifically within the Pike Delta York Local School District. The District continues to seek ways to maximize the local property wealth of the district by maximizing its ability to obtain funding through community reinvestment and revenue sharing agreements. The utilization of property tax legislation will maximize returns to the district as commercial and residential abatements expire. Several businesses have relocated to the community, providing eventual long-term resources.

The District continues to work toward financial stability while being responsible to the taxpayers of the community. The utilization of multiple purchasing consortiums to help secure discounted products, goods, services and equipment. Some examples of discounted items include buses, insurances (property and health), utilities, food products, instructional supplies and cleaning and maintenance supplies. The District utilizes a central storage warehousing system that allows purchasing resources in large quantities at a discounted price, saving the district significant dollars annually.

In fiscal year 2022, the district collected 49% of our revenue from local sources and 51% from the state of Ohio. We continue to provide a vital service to the community in the form of a high quality education at a very reasonable level. The district will continue to monitor its financial stability as we work together to achieve the best academic and developmental outcomes for every student within a fiscally sustainable budget.

The District administration and staff have applied for and received approximately \$2,000,000 in grant dollars in fiscal year 2022. This allows the reallocation of vital resources in the areas of professional development, media and technology and student services.

STUDENT SERVICES



Five years ago, PDY began a two-year kindergarten program to better serve students who are age-appropriate but not academically ready for the traditional kindergarten classroom. This program provides early interventions to prepare students for the traditional kindergarten classroom and increases student success for many years to come.

The Pike-Delta-York Local School District is proud to host the Health Partners of Western Ohio's mobile dentist. This in-house dental program offers services to students in grades kindergarten through eight at no out-of-pocket cost to families.

Delta Middle School features a school-wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Support system called the Jungle. The system focuses on reinforcing healthy student behaviors in order to build a positive student culture. Each teacher has a classroom store where students can redeem their Pride Points for privilege, recognition, and tangible items. The school also holds raffles for gift cards and incentive events students may qualify for. The Jungle uses PBIS Rewards for a digital token economy, disciplinary referral system, and data tool to plan building initiatives.

The District's Food Service Department offers students additional meal options with an alternative menu. These meal option changes have led to an increase in total number of meals served district-wide. In the first semester of the 2021-2022 school year, the Department served 28, 242 breakfast meals and 100, 089 lunch meals to students!

The District boasts a trained bilingual professional on staff, which helps to accommodate the many Spanish-speaking students in our community. This staff member also serves the district as an interpreter with parents who are limited English speaking in many instances as well.

The District's Transportation Department organizes in-town bussing in order to minimize exposure to traffic and weather conditions. Group bus stops have been generated in most areas of town. Currently, the District transports approximately 600 students, traveling 885 miles per day.

The District has partnered with RFS Behavioral Health (T.A.C.K.L.E.) to provide mental health services to PDY students of all ages so they can gain the tools needed to overcome day-to-day challenges. This program helps ensure our students' health, engagement, and safety needs are met.

PARENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Community Partners

The Pike-Delta-York Local School District has joined with several business partners to offer FFA students the chance to work in a Land Lab for hands-on agricultural education to apply skills such as sampling soil, creating precision-plotted maps based on soil data, and more.



Both Delta High School and Delta Middle School have partnered with Healthy Choices Caring Communities Coalition (HC3) to educate students and families about the dangers of substance abuse and destructive behaviors.

The District partners with the Delta Chamber of Commerce to host Safety Village each year for incoming kindergarten students. This event helps students learn about topics designed to keep them safe, including traffic safety and crossing streets, the danger of talking to strangers, and how to walk safely down the road.

Delta Elementary's Coach Cory's Backpack Buddies is a program that provides supplemental food to community families in need. All students in the program are given a backpack of donated supplemental food every Friday in an effort to help meet the family's needs over the weekend.



Parents and Families

Each Veteran's Day, Delta Middle School's students and staff honor local heroes with a Veteran's Day Breakfast and ceremony. This patriotic opportunity to honor veterans is highlighted by guest speakers addressing the students.

Delta High School has hosted a yearly Senior Citizens Luncheon for over 30 years! The luncheon is an opportunity to invite community retirees and senior citizens into the school for a time of fellowship and music performances by the Del-Aires and the DHS band.

Delta Elementary School staff hosts a Family Reading Night in the fall to promote literacy skills and parent involvement. Students and parents enjoy participating in various reading-themed centers to show our love of reading. DES hosts a Family Math Night in the spring to focus on grade-level math skills.

Multiple parent organizations within the District offer tremendous support to student groups by volunteering time and talent in a variety of ways. They work to raise funds to help purchase classroom materials through programs like Box Tops for Education and many other fundraising ventures.

The Pike-Delta-York Local School District utilizes an online student registration system called Final Forms. This system allows students' records to be housed more securely with an easier transition from building to building, and also allows families to update records more easily as needed and from year to year.

The District has expanded the use of Canvas, a district-wide Learning Management System (LMS), so parents have a consistent way to access student academic information from building to building. This system allows students and teachers to collaborate more closely by helping students to access grades and assignments online with a way to directly message the teacher if there are questions. Both middle school and high school teachers maintain active Canvas classrooms.
