Tyler is playing *Candyland* using first grade sight words. Dwight wants to play too, so Tyler is reading the sight words to him! In Title groups we try to use fun activities to practice sight words and sight word phrases.

Sight words are important in recognizing letter patterns and found frequently in writing. Sight words are called Fry, Dolch, high frequency and common words. These words are phonetically irregular, so cannot always be "sounded out". Two common example of sight words are "know" and "only". It is critical for students to develop

automaticity when reading sight words for their literacy development.
